

LEADERSHIP ENHANCEMENT OPPORTUNITIES (LEO's)

What are LEOs? Objective tests given to FCCLA members at fall leadership trainings, regional FCCLA meetings and at the state FCCLA meeting. Students may take the tests at all meetings, but may only take one test at each.

What areas are tested? Child Development, Consumer Math, Consumer Quiz, Creed, Mission and Purposes, Culinary Arts, Education and Training, Etiquette, Hospitality, Interior Design, Job Interview, Step One, and Parliamentary Procedure

Do students get recognition for taking the tests? Every student receives a certificate for their accomplishments. Students scoring higher than 85 receive a gold medal; students with scores between 84-70 receive a silver medal and students scoring between 69-55 receive a bronze medal.

What are some sample test questions?

Creed, Mission and Purposes: students must know the FCCLA creed, mission statement and purposes and be able to complete them by selecting the correct part of the statement from multiple choice questions. Examples are:

Consumer Math: Questions focus on math questions pertaining to issues any consumer may need to know. Examples:

1. A budget is a plan based on:
 - A. income
 - B. expenses
 - C. **income and expenses**
 - D. none of the above
2. Dinner in a restaurant costs \$32.10. What should be left for a 20% tip?
 - A. \$8.29
 - B. **\$6.42**
 - C. \$5.25
 - D. \$3.21

Consumer Quiz: focus on areas tied to the Lifesmarts program (see: www.lifesmarts.org) The areas of focus are: Personal Finance, Health and Safety, Environment, Technology, Consumer Rights and Responsibilities. Examples are:

1. You can tell if you have high blood pressure by:
 - A. watching for symptoms
 - B. having it tested**
 - C. taking your pulse
2. A vehicle manufacturer's warranty generally does not cover:
 - A. repairing a flat tire**
 - B. engine defects
 - C. transmission problems

Etiquette: this test will have questions pertaining to setting a table, basic etiquette information related to meals, introductions, etc. Questions are true and false and multiple choice. Examples are:

1. T/F One should always write the host a thank you letter after being at a dinner party.
2. T/F Conversation at a formal social event should be about controversial items.

Interior Design: Information on this test is found in the FCS curriculum related to design, elements and principles and careers in this area. Examples are:

1. Which scale is most commonly used by architects, contractors and designers?
 - A. 1/8"
 - B. $\frac{1}{4}$ "
 - C. $\frac{1}{2}$ "
2. The definition of antiques furniture is a piece that is:
 - A. more than 100 years old**
 - B. passed on from one generation to another
 - C. more than 75 years old

Job Interview: Basic job interview facts are asked during this multiple choice and true/false tests. Examples are:

1. Good references would not include:
 - A. **family**
 - B. teachers
 - C. employers
 - D. friends parents
2. T/F Resumes should include graphics.

Step One: Basic facts about FCCLA are asked in this test. Examples are:
